Well, it's hard to believe the summer is now behind us! Since our last Newsletter, we've produced the Winnemucca Summer Cutting and the Eureka Cow Horse Show and approved the Winnemucca Stock Horse Classic & Derby as well as the Elko Stallion Stakes (NRCHA show).

The Winnemucca Summer Cutting was a success with a good number of entries and some from as far as Vegas! Complete results can be found at www.nrccha.com. However, a few highlights include Gavin Jordan's 75 on Smoothlee As A Cat winning the \$15,000 Novice Horse on Friday and Ryan Long's 73 taking home \$900 in the Non Pro. Monty Buntin marked a 75 on Bewitched Boon to win the Open Classic on Saturday while Jack Dawson scored a 74 in the \$50,000 Amateur on Sunday taking home \$950.40!

Concurrently, the Winnemucca Stock Horse Classic & Derby was happening outside with many of our cow horse members participating, including Nick Dowers, the 2013 Snaffle Bit Futurity Champion!

The Eureka Cow Horse show had to be cancelled after 3 classes due to rain. Once again hard to complain about the rain, but folks had traveled many miles to show their horses only to get their entries refunded.

The Elko Stallion Stakes held during the Elko County Fair was a fun time as always. Nothing like showing your cow horse with the horse races happening on the track just over the rail!

The Snaffle Bit Futurity concluded on October 3. NRC & CHA had several entries in the Snaffle Bit (3 year old) but also great representation in the Horse Show classes. It's such an honor to be able to just 'haul in' for the NRCHA's Premier Event!


We just have 1 more show left in the year so we hope you will come on out for the Stix Fall Cutting October 10 & 11. One more chance to get your horse shown and support your local club.

Darrel rode Over A Barrel, owned by Joyce Diegel, in the preliminary round of 41 horses, placing 3rd to get to the Final round of 11 horses. He clinched the championship with a 219.5 on the rein work and a 222.0 on his fence work for a 441.5 composite score, 2 and a half points ahead of the next competitor!
